#### **Protective Factors**

Protective factors exert a positive influence and buffer against the negative influence of risk, thus reducing the likelihood that adolescents will engage in problem behaviors.

#### 6th Grade

- Parental Attitudes Favorable to Anti-Social Behavior (59.0 up from 45.9 in 2019)
- Low Commitment to School (53.7 up from 40.9 in 2019 and 32.6 in 2017)
- Poor Family Management (49.8 up from 37.0 in 2019)

#### 8th Grade

- Low Commitment to School (53.3 up from 49.1 in 2019 and 38.5 in 2017)
- Parental Attitudes Favorable toward Anti-Social Behavior (47.1 up from 36.9 in 2019)
- Perceived Risk of Drug Use (47.1 up from 35.1 in 2019 and 34.0 in 2017)

#### 10th Grade

- Low Commitment to School (60.1 up from 55.9 in 2019 and 58.3 in 2017)
- Depressive Symptoms (50.6 up from 45.3 in 2019 and 40.8 in 2017)
- Parental Attitudes Favorable to Anti-Social Behavior (46.4 up from 44.1 in 2019)

#### 12th Grade

- Perceived Risk of Drug Use (49.2 down from 60.1 in 2019 and 54.5 in 2017)
- Depressive Symptoms (46.2 down from 50.5 in 2019 and up from 35.9 in 2017)
- Parental Attitudes Favorable to Anti-Social Behavior (42.5 down from 44.1 in 2019)

# Tobacco and Marijuana



Smokeless Tobacco (30-day use) decreased across all grades:

- 6<sup>th</sup> grade (0.3% in 2017 to 0.0% in 2021)
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade (2.1% in 2017 to 0.4% in 2021)
- 10<sup>th</sup> grade (6.8% in 2017 to 0.8% in 2021)
- 12<sup>th</sup> grade (10.2% in 2017 to 2.0% in 2021)

- **Lifetime use** by 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students is below the state average. Lifetime use by 12<sup>th</sup> graders is slightly above the state average but has decreased from 49.5% to 31.5% between 2019 and 2021.
- 10<sup>th</sup> graders report **30-Day use** at a slightly higher rate (10.2%) than the state average (8.0%) and 30-Day use has decreased from 2019 to 2021 across all grades.
- 4.1% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders report **driving after marijuana use** in the past year, down from 10.5% in 2019 and 11.5% in 2017.
- More students in 10th and 12th grade report using marijuana than cigarettes for both lifetime use and 30-day use.
- 23.0% of 12th graders reported a willingness to try marijuana before age 21, down from 37.6% in 2019.

## Alcohol

#### **Usage Behaviors**



- ↑ Lower Dauphin lifetime use is higher than the National Average across all grades: 8<sup>th</sup> (30.2% to 26.9%); 10<sup>th</sup> (45.5% to 34.7%); 12<sup>th</sup> (55.0% to 54.1%)
- **Lower Dauphin lifetime use saw a decrease across all grades (2019 to 2021):** 6<sup>th</sup> (12.5% to 11.0%); 8<sup>th</sup> (31.5% to 30.2%); 10<sup>th</sup> (55.0% to 45.5%); 12<sup>th</sup> (72.2% to 55.0%)

#### PAST 30-DAY USE

- ↑ Lower Dauphin is higher than the State Average in Past 30-Day Use across all grades: 6<sup>th</sup> (3.8% to 3.1%); 8<sup>th</sup> (10.3% to 6.9%); 10<sup>th</sup> (18.4% to 16.1%); 12<sup>th</sup> (30.2% to 27.4%)
- The rate of 12<sup>th</sup> graders who reported driving a vehicle after drinking alcohol during the past year declined every year since 2017, from 6.3% in 2017 to 2.5% in 2021.
- ◆ The rate of 12<sup>th</sup> graders who reported driving a vehicle after using marijuana during the past year declined every year since 2017, from 11.6% in 2017 to 4.1% in 2021.
- **▶** Binge Drinking rates also decreased in grade 12 (from 18.0% in 2017 to 27.3% in 2019 to 15.1% in 2021) and grade 10 (from 10.8% in 2017 to 13.3% in 2019 to 7.0% in 2021).

**72.2%** of 10<sup>th</sup> graders reported that they would not be caught by the police for underage drinking.

#### **Sources for Obtaining Alcohol**

- 34.3% of students reported that their parents gave them alcohol (up from 19.5% in 2019).
- Primary source for obtaining alcohol for 12<sup>th</sup> graders (38.4%) was "Friends, brothers or sisters over 21 provided it to me" (2019 rate was 39.8%). Rate for LD 10<sup>th</sup> graders was 23.9% (21.1% in 2019).
- 44.8% 10<sup>th</sup> graders reported that their primary source for obtaining alcohol was "took it without permission (from my home, friend's home, store, etc".
- **55.6**% of 6<sup>th</sup> graders and **45**% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders reported their primary source for alcohol was parents provided it to them.

- **❖ 34.9%** of 12<sup>th</sup> graders and **40.7%** of 10<sup>th</sup> graders reported being so sad they ceased doing their usual activities.
- ❖ 37.2% of students experienced death of a friend/family member in the past year (down from 40.2 in 2019).
- ❖ 7.7% of students worried that food would run out one or more times in the past year (down from 10.3% 2019) and 4.9% reported skipping a meal because of family finances.

#### Behaviors, Self-Harm, and Suicide

- 16.4% of students reported self-harm (such as cutting, scraping, burning), with the highest numbers reported by 10<sup>th</sup> graders (20.1%) and 8<sup>th</sup> graders (18.9%).
- 21.6% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders and 24.6% of 10<sup>th</sup> graders reported seriously considered suicide and 6.9% and 12.7%, respectively, attempted suicide.
- Of students who indicated they had been cyberbullied:
  - 61.2% indicated feeling so sad or hopeless every day for at least 2 weeks that they stopped doing their usual activities;
  - 41.5% of those students had seriously considered suicide in the past year; 33.8% had made a suicide plan; and 30.1% had attempted suicide.

# Mental Health & Wellness (Continued)

#### **Energy and Sleep**

#### 37.0% of students

reported **sleeping LESS THAN 7 HOURS a night on school nights** including 47.7% of 10<sup>th</sup> graders and 46.7% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders.

#### 70.3% of students

reported FEELING TIRED OR SLEEPY during the day "every day" or "several times" during the past two weeks, including 77.7% of 10<sup>th</sup> graders and 78.8% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders.

#### **Activities and Employment**

- 61.3% of all students reported engaging in school sponsored activities.
- 81.7% of seniors reported having a job or employment; 40.3% reported volunteering; and 13.2% said they do not participate.

#### Within the Family

- 95.1% of students in all grades reported that their parents knew where they were and who they were with.
- 85.5% of students reported that there are clear family rules about alcohol and drug use. This ranges from 88.5% of 6<sup>th</sup> graders to 83.4% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders.
